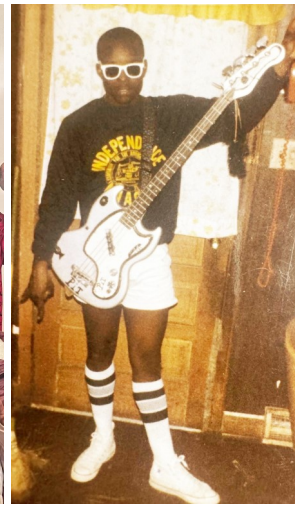

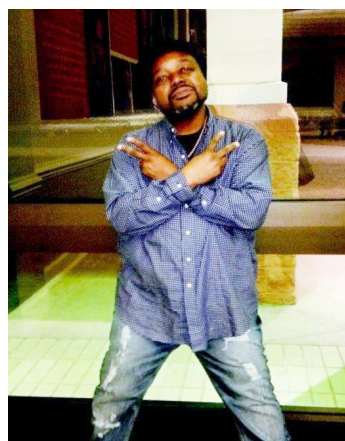
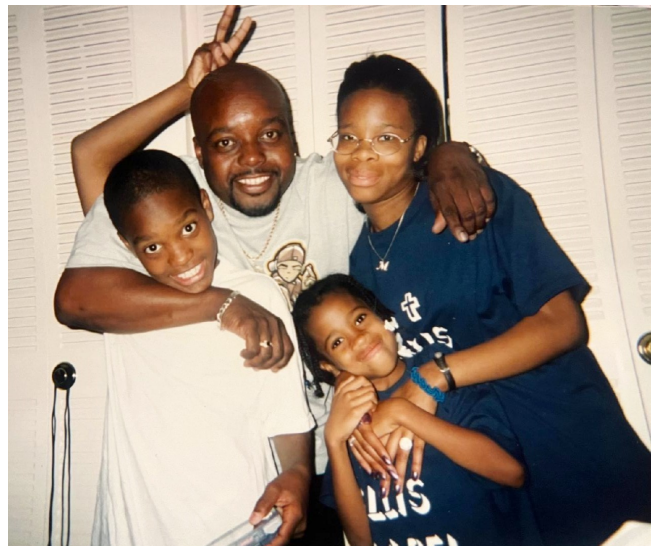
Happy Anniversary to my everything.
