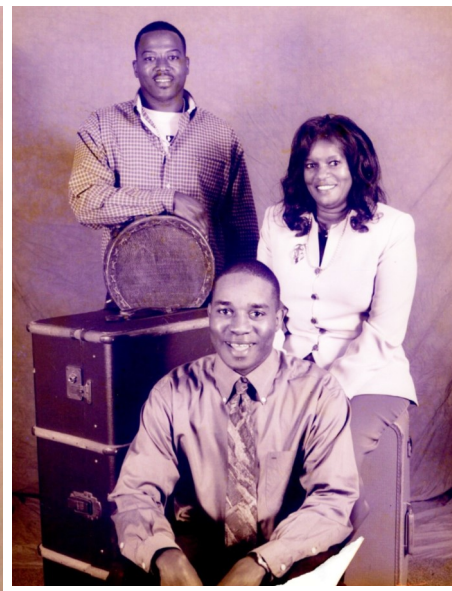
Bettye lived a life devoted to Christ, her family, and her friends. She was known for her feistiness, strength, kindness, and love for those around her.
