Mr. Louis Calvin Haynes, 89, of Shelby, NC, passed away on April 23, 2026, at Atrium Health Cleveland. He was born in Cleveland County, NC, to the late Eddie Haynes and Cora Lumpkin Haynes on January 5, 1937.

Louis attended Douglas High School. He was a hardworking man who took care of his family. He was a provider, working at Cleveland Lumber for several years. From there he went to PPG Industries and retired after 35 years of employment as a Material Handler. He had a way of tinkering with things when they were broken and fixing them back just right.

Louis was known as a jokester, one who would make an off-the-wall comment to make you laugh. His nickname was 'C Mo' because he tended to be nosy. He'd comment, "I ain't trying to be nosy, but....."
