Troy was the oldest of three children. He received his education in the Franklin Special School District and the Williamson County School System, graduating from Franklin High School in 1991. Troy accepted Christ and was a member at Limestone Baptist Church.

Troy has always had a love for dump trucks and had the opportunity to have a successful career in doing what he loved. As the owner operator of Hambrick 1 Trucking, he started Hambrick 1 Trucking in 2005 with a sixty-dollar loan from his grandmother. That small loan allowed him to get his Commercial Driver's License. With further assistance from family and friends he was able to purchase his first truck and get the business off the ground. Troy grew Hambrick 1 Trucking into a successful enterprise and was honored as a "Business Owner" by the African American Heritage Society of Williamson County in 2024. His business has been around for almost two decades.

Troy was known for his sense of humor, infectious grin and generosity. He supported causes that benefit the communities of Franklin and Spring Hill. He was a member of the Williamson County Chamber of Commerce, a contributor to the Boys and Girls Club of America, and other community and civic organizations.
