Reflection of Life

Orisher Wilhelmina McDaniel was born February 25, 1920, near Bowman, SC, in the Old Mount Zion Church Community. She was the oldest daughter of the late Joseph W. McDaniel and the late Birdie Shuler McDaniel. She died on Monday afternoon, June 26, 2023, following an extended illness, at Pruitt Health-Orangeburg Nursing Home.

Orisher was deeply religious, and in 1952, she made her dedication to Jehovah. She was baptized in 1953 at Orchid Beach, while attending the International Assembly held in New York City. Orisher devoted her life to Jehovah and loved street witnessing and doing field work. She remained a faithful publisher of the Good News of God's Kingdom.

Orisher's secular education included formal education in elementary and high school in Bowman School District and South Carolina State University. She worked 34 years teaching at Orangeburg Training School in Elluree, SC and Bowman School District #2 in Bowman, SC.
