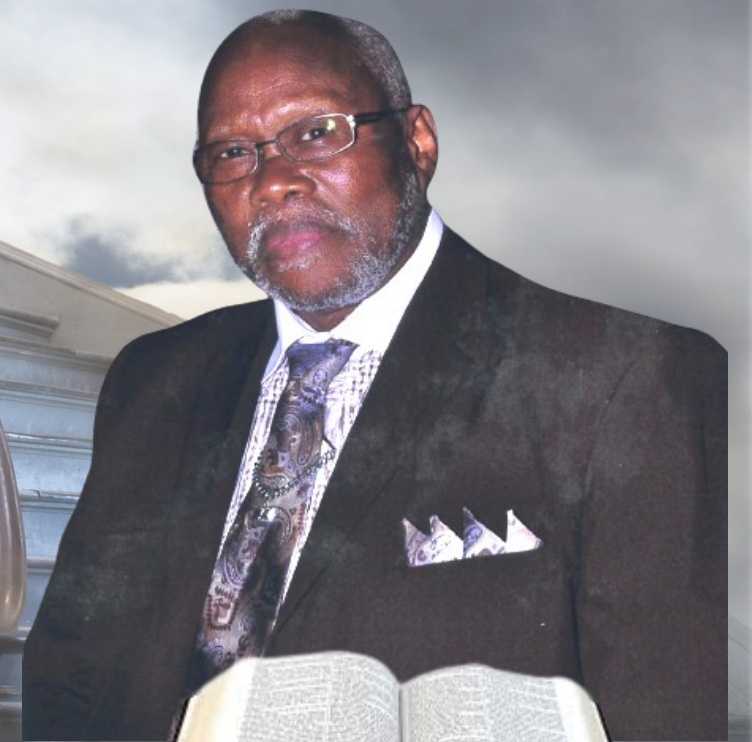

The Obituary

Deacon Henry Lloyd

was born May 14, 1935 in Dorchester County, SC, the tenth and last child of Mr. Richard and Mrs. Soviller Weldon Lloyd. At an early age, Henry relocated to Queens, New York. In 1956, Henry enlisted in the U.S. Marines and spent most of his time in Hawaii.

Upon his return to New York, he married the late Evelyn (Ida) White. To this union three children were born- Brenda, Maury and Matthew.

He was employed with Cement & Concrete Workers Local 6A, Tasty Twins, and American Yard Products.

On February 18, 1967, Henry received the Baptism of the Holy Ghost under the Pastorship of the late Elder Mamie Leak at 1236 Bedford Ave. From that time on, Henry became very inquisitive and wanted to know everything he needed to know and do to make it into the kingdom of God. Henry was ordained as a Deacon in Nashville, TN in 1980. He was the chairman Deacon at Orangeburg Mission. Deacon Lloyd loved the Lord first and foremost.
