




Early Sunday morning, November 19, 2023, the Lord called unto himself, his servant, Jerome Archie Brown. Jerome, the third of four children was born to Mr. Martie and Mrs. Coleen Littlejohn Brown in Washington DC at the Freeman Memorial Hospital. At an early age, Mrs. Brown was called from labor to reward, leaving Jerome in the loving hands of his aunt and uncle, Mrs. Ailean & Mr. Lockhart Harris.

Jerome's educational achievements began by receiving his formative education in the public school system of Gaffney, SC. Jerome graduated from Gaffney High School having the distinction of being the first African American to attend and graduate. Jerome then matriculated to South Carolina State College (University) where he received his B.S. degree in Music Education and his Master's Degree in Elementary Education. He was also a graduate of Nova Southeastern University where he received his Doctorate in Curriculum Development in Youth and Child Studies.




Jerome was taught the Word of God and baptized at an early age at the Mt. Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Gaffney, SC. Jerome was a member of St. Paul Baptist Church, Orangeburg, SC, where he served on the Board of Deacons leading his Ward. He was the former Minister of Music as well as the President of the H. T. Williams Singers. Jerome served as organist and music director for Canaan United Methodist Church in Cope, South Carolina.

Dr. Jerome Brown was a retired employee of the Orangeburg Consolidated School District Four where he served as a music and drama teacher, choral director, science and social studies teacher, and District Arts Coordinator; a job he enjoyed for 38 years. Dr. Brown was director of the Orangeburg-Calhoun Consortium for the Arts, a summer arts program for artistically gifted and talent students in the areas of Music, Art, Dance and Drama. Dr. Brown was employed with the Orangeburg Consolidated School District Five at William J. Clark Middle School as Choral Director. He was a member of the following organizations: The South Carolina Music Educators Association, the National Association of Music Education, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity Inc., the National Education Association, and the South Carolina Education Association. His awards include Teacher Incentive Award for Superior Teaching (1988, 1989, 1990, and 1991), Teacher of the Year Carver-Edisto Middle School (1988), District Teacher of the Year Edisto District Schools (1990) and listed in Outstanding Young Men of America (1986 ed.). In 2022, Dr. Brown was recognized as a Trailblazer from The School of the Great Commission Bible College and Seminary.



Jerome met and was united in holy matrimony to Beverly Ann Young in 1978. This union, sanctioned by God was blessed with three children, Jonathan, Dexter and Asia. Later in life, he was also blessed to be a grandfather.


