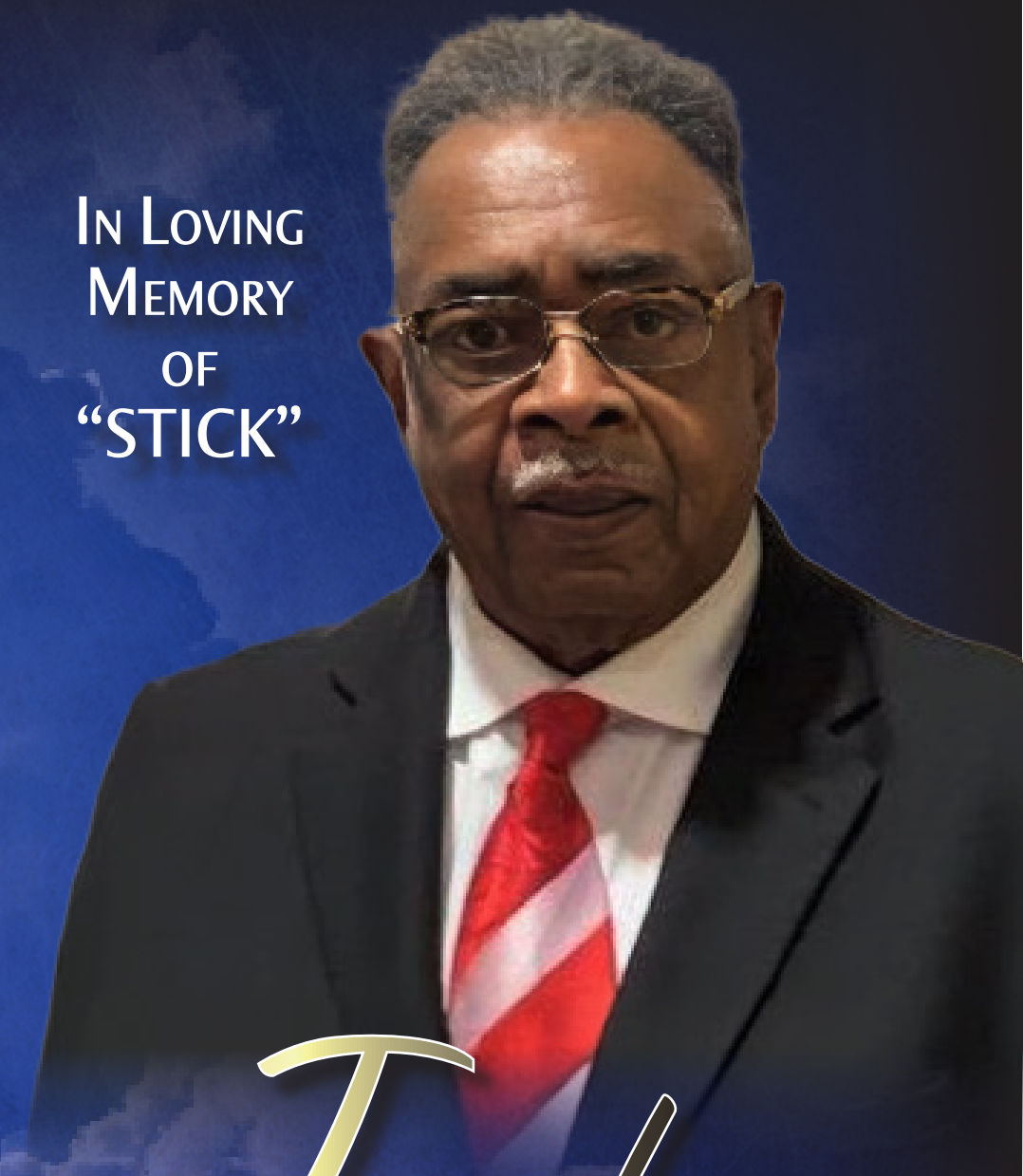

- The Obituary -

Mr. Jordan Bostick, Jr., son of the late Mr. Jordan and Mrs. Emma Stroud Bostick, Sr., was born December 26, 1941, in Elmore County, Alabama.

At an early age, he confessed Christ and united with New Adka Missionary Baptist Church in Dadeville, Alabama.

“Stick”, as he was affectionately known by family and friends, graduated from J.F. Drake High School Class of 1959. After graduating, he attended Jarvis Christian College in Hawkins, Texas. He was very active in sports throughout his life, from playing football in high school and college as well as coaching children in baseball and other sports.

After college, Jordan married Margaret Blackmon where they lived in Atlanta, Georgia with their three beloved sons for over ten years. During that time, he began working in the construction industry, specializing in sheetrock installation. In the late 1970’s, he returned to Auburn, Alabama and continued to work in the construction field. He later started working for Lee County in General Maintenance where he retired.

Because of his concern for the civil rights of people in the community, Jordan became actively involved with the Lee County Voters League and the Lee County Concerned Citizens.

In “Stick’s” spare time, he loved to fish and participated in the Auburn University sponsored fishing tournaments every year, often with one of his sons or grandson. He was an excellent cook and had a passion for preparing different “soul food” dishes for his family.

On Wednesday, July 10, 2024, Jordan departed this life at the East Alabama Medical Center in Opelika, Alabama. He was preceded in death by his parents and sister, Shirley Cromartie.
