

John H. Lockhart, son of the late Mr. Arthur V. Lockhart and Mrs. Katie Dowdell Lockhart, was born on October 4, 1941, in Lee County, Alabama. He began his remarkable life journey in Lee County, where he quickly distinguished himself as an exceptional athlete, becoming the youngest captain of his football team at J.F. Drake High School. John graduated as part of the Class of 1961 and continued his education at Tuskegee University.

John later married the love of his life, Sheree Benita Lockhart. Together, they built a home filled with love and devotion, nurturing seven children. His deep sense of duty to both his family and community guided his life.

John dedicated thirty years to serving the citizens of Auburn with an unwavering commitment to public service. His career began with the City of Auburn Parks and Recreation Department, where he fostered his passion for improving the community. His friendship with John Dunn, Auburn's first African American police officer, ignited an interest in law enforcement that changed the trajectory of his life. Inspired by Dunn, John answered a new calling to serve and protect, becoming Auburn's second African American police officer and eventually rising to the rank of its first African American police captain. Over the course of twenty-five years with the Auburn Police Department, he worked tirelessly to ensure safety and justice for all residents. He retired on May 31, 1995, after three decades of public service, leaving behind a legacy of leadership and commitment.































































































Faith was a cornerstone of John's life. He was a devoted member of Mt. Traveler Missionary Baptist Church, where he served as a Deacon, Treasurer, and Co-Chair of the Cemetery Ministry. He also contributed to the church as a member of the Trustee Board, Laymen Ministry, and in previous roles as Chairman of the Trustee Board, Sunday School Superintendent, and President of both the Laymen Ministry and Usher Board. His leadership extended to the Ebenezer District, where he served as Vice President of the Congress under Presidents Archie Simpson and Willie Williams. John's impact also reached the Southeast District State Convention, where he served as Vice President of SEDSC Laymen for eight years under President Tommy Robinson. His service was further recognized by his appointment as Alabama State Laymen on the Memorial Committee under President Alvin Moore.

Beyond his church, John made it his mission to improve the quality of life in his community. He was a civic leader who served on numerous organizations, including the East Alabama Task Force for Battered Women, the East Alabama Peace Officers Association, and the International Association of Chiefs of Police. His dedication to his city earned him a prestigious Lamplighter Award from Auburn Mayor Ron Anders in November 2022, a fitting tribute to his lifetime of service.

John H. Lockhart departed this life peacefully on Thursday, September 25, 2024, and will be deeply missed by all who had the honor of knowing him. He was preceded in death by his granddaughter, Diamond Askew; grandson, John Harvey Lockhart; and nine siblings: Ilean Byrd, Ora Lee Webb, Lonnie Lockhart (Dora), Shahedah Shaheed, David Lockhart, Geraldine Philpot (Billy), Conway Dowdell, Virgis (Johnnie) Dowdell, and Robert Dowdell.
