## - The Obituary -

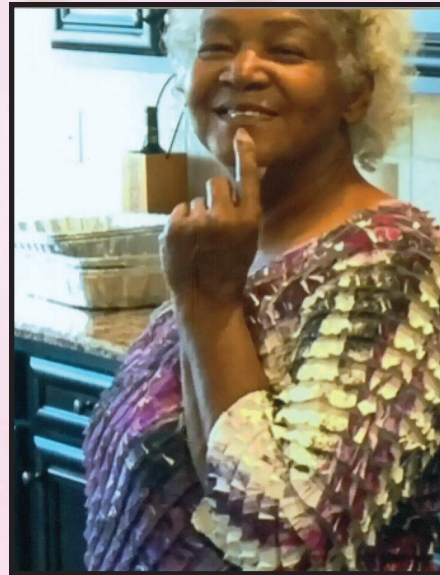
