

Christopher's legacy is one of love, laughter, and an unwavering zest for life. He touched the lives of many with his generosity of spirit and his ability to see the good in everyone.






























































His memory will live on in the hearts of those who knew him, and his influence will continue to be felt by the countless lives he has touched.




