Katrina Louise Love, daughter of Eunice Love Jones and the late Wardell Pitts, was born February 16, 1967, in Macon County, AL. She accepted Christ early in life and united with the Providence Missionary Baptist Church in Society Hill, AL.

Trina attended the public schools of Lee County AL, graduating as Salutatorian of the 1985 class of Beauregard High School. She chose to further her education at Auburn University of Montgomery, receiving the Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration in 1989.

Eager to show her expertise in the Business world, Katrina accepted employment in San Francisco, CA and was promoted and appointed to a team to open the Regional Offices with Charles H. Schwab, in Pheonix, AR. After many years of residing in Arizona, Katrina followed God's command and returned home to assist with her aging grandmother, the late Regina Love.

Understanding the need to be self-sufficient, Trina gained employment as Manager of the Subway Franchise in Opelika, later accepting the position as Manager of the Tuskegee Subway location.

Continuing to follow God's plan for her Christian path in life, Katrina changed her faith to Methodist while never wavering in her zeal to serve the Lord. As she studied and moved closer to God as a member of the AME Zion faith, she worshipped and served at AME Zion at the Hill Church, Auburn, AL. As she grew in Christ, she was blessed to serve as Pastor of both Creekstand AME Zion, Union Springs, AL and St. John AME Zion, Tuskegee, AL.

Always eager to improve herself, she enrolled in Hood Theological Seminary, Salisbury, NC and earning A Master of Divinity Degree. As an active member of the AME Zion District of Alabama, she was an appointed Conference Evangelist at Butler Chapel AME Zion Church in Tuskegee, AL, where she served as the Assistant Pastor.

Rev. Love's affiliations were many and varied. Never meeting a stranger, it was evident in her love of family, Tuskegee University, and an unwavering love to help anyone she met.

While Katrina worked with many local organizations within the City of Tuskegee and the County delivering food from the area food banks, serving where needed and supporting local events, she was most proud of her role as the first Woman President of the Tuskegee Ministerial Council, being a weekly Religious contributor to the Tuskegee News, and serving as Director and CEO of "Lets PRAY Tuskegee," her daily motto. Despite her full schedule, she always found time to take a trip to the beach, the lake or even the mountains to commune with nature.
