## - Obituary -

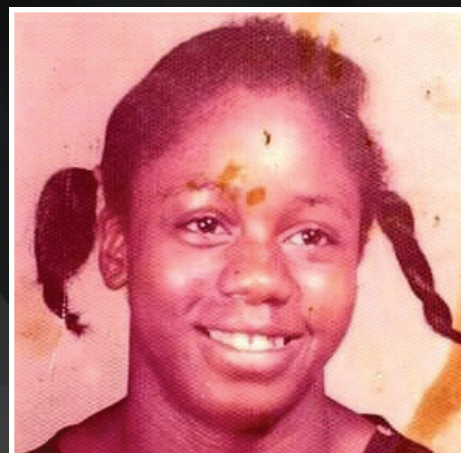
