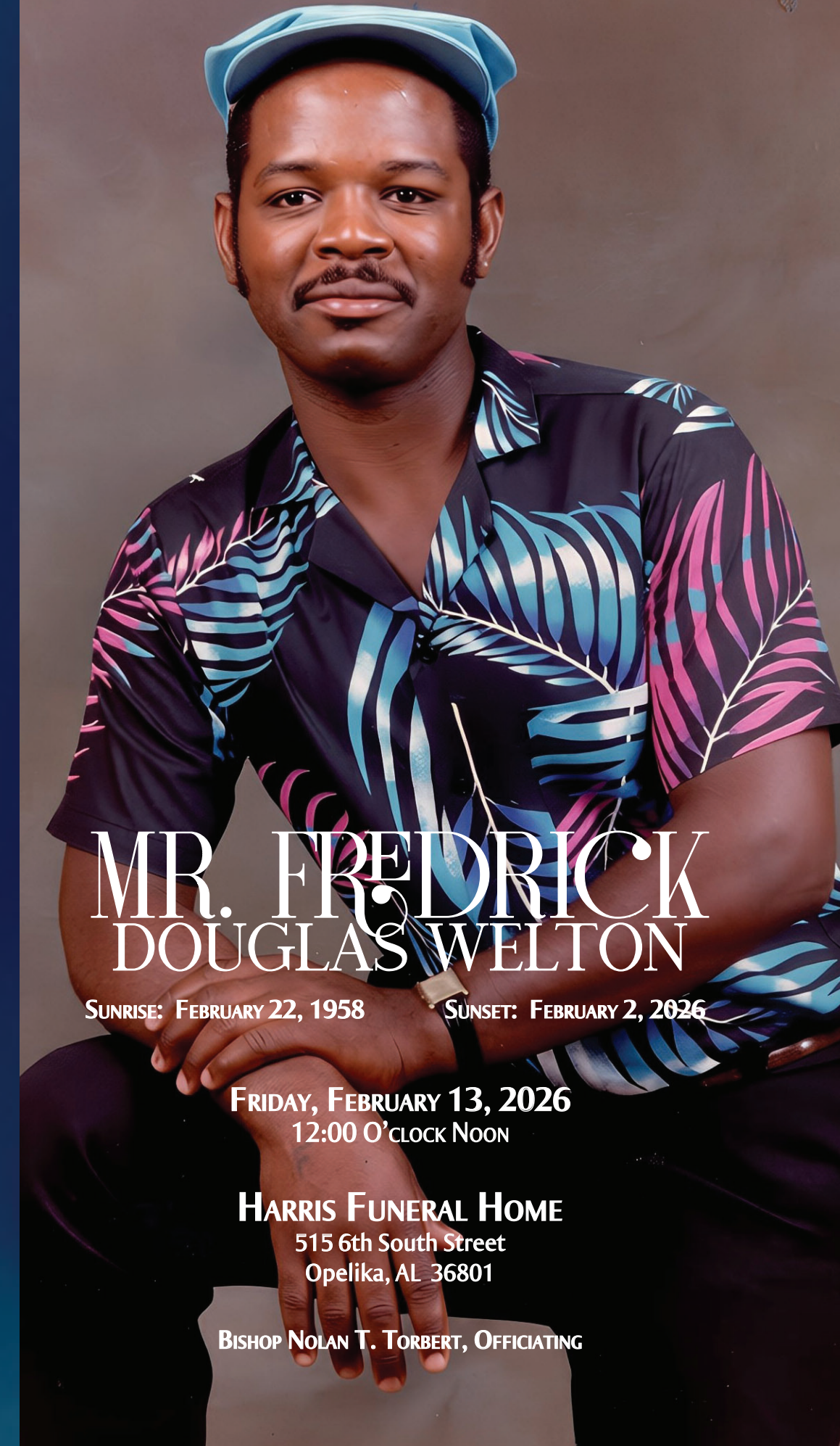

At an early age, he accepted Christ. Fred was educated in the Birmingham, Alabama School system. He worked at West Point Stevens as a Slasher Operator.

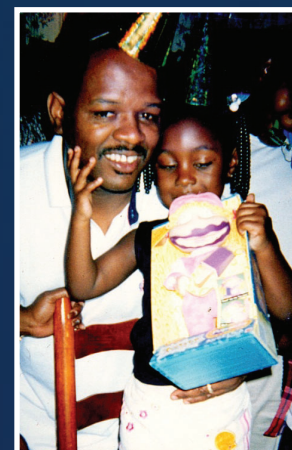
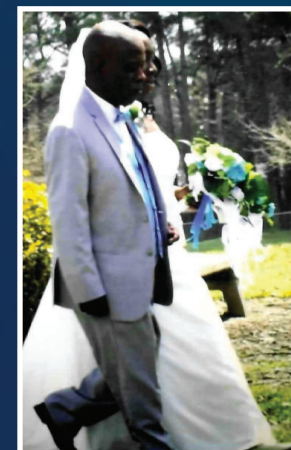
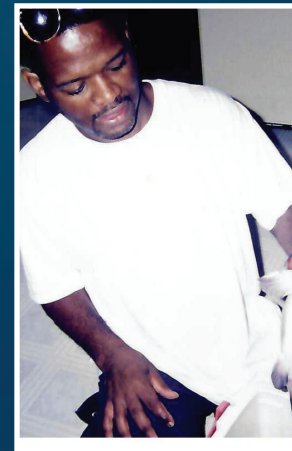
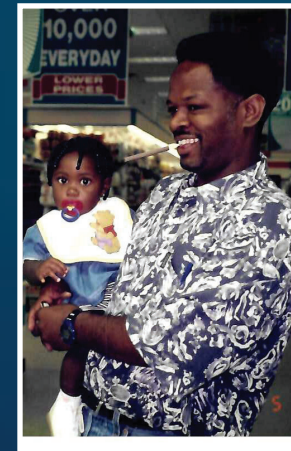
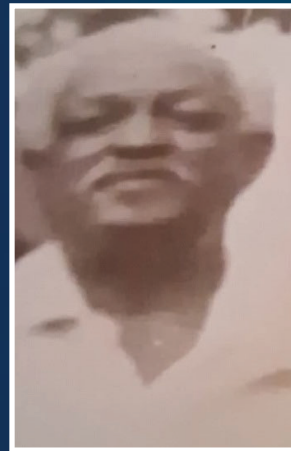
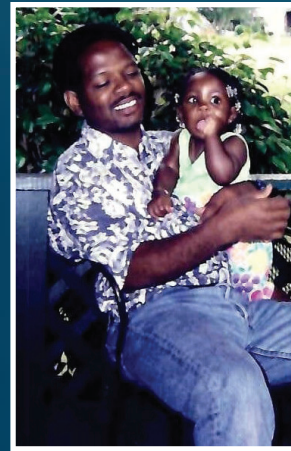
