Burtchus "Reton" Lathan, Sr.

Burtchus "Reton" Lathan entered eternal rest on Sunday, June 30, 2024. He was born on March 19, 1930, in Pumpkinton, SC to the late Albert and Erma Lathan.

Reton received his early education in Rutherford County public schools, graduating from Carver High School, in Spindale NC. He also attended North Carolina College for Negroes, in Durham, NC, now known as North Carolina Central University. His professional career included teaching brick masonry at R.S. Central High School in Rutherfordton, NC. After 30+ years of teaching, he retired from the Rutherford County School System. Following his retirement Reton continued his passion for brick masonry hardscape work.

Reton was very wise and well-respected. He loved his family and community deeply. His hobbies included listening to jazz, watching his favorite television show *Hee Haw*, cooking and smoking barbeque, as well as hosting family and friends at his home.
