

Am Always With You

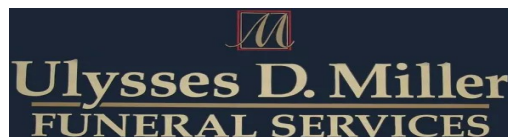
When I am gone, release me, let me go.
