Reflections of Life

Mr. Robert Walker, 89 years old, of Cuthbert, GA passed away on September 21, 2024. Mr. Walker was born on August 15, 1935 in Cuthbert, GA To the late Ellis Walker and Parie Ada Walker. He was a member of the Pleasant Grove Methodist Church, which subsequently united with the Payne Chapel AME Church. Mr. Walker, who preferred to be called by his nickname, Shank, was a devoted husband to Mrs. Martha Walker for 70 years and a loving devoted father to his two sons: Charles Hagan and Eric Johnson.

Shank quit school at an early age. He had a sharp mind and was a brilliant conceptual thinker. His problem-solving skills enabled him to build houses, repair cars and visualize solutions to problems that other folks were unsuccessfully trying to figure out. Shank taught himself how to do basic construction work such as framing houses, laying bricks and basic carpentry and electrical work. To everyone who knew him he was Shank and a pillar of the community. He was a humble unpretentious man. When he was admitted to the hospital, a nurse called him Mr. Walker, In a soft pleasant voice he said, "my name is Shank." To his boys he was just Dad and that's what we called him.

Dad was soft-spoken, hardworking and honest, a man who didn't make excuses and finished what he started. He loved to fish, hunt and play checkers. If you wanted to get a smile from him, you only had to challenge him to a game of checkers. In his youth and early adult years he was considered an excellent hunter and fisherman. These skills were not only for sport but were absolutely necessary during the fifties and early sixties when times were hard on the family.

Dad was the youngest of five brothers and a sister. They relied on him to assist whenever there was a house that needed to be built or added onto. He was a father to his two sons and a father figure to his nieces and nephews who lost their fathers. He was a generous man and a diplomat in the neighborhood because everyone liked him, and he could get along with anyone because of his pleasant manner and easy-going attitude. He was always willing to help a neighbor when he could.

Dad is survived by his wife Martha Walker, his two sons Charles Hagan and Eric Johnson. His grandchildren: Tracey Hagan, Charles Hagan, Jr. Mitchell Hagan, Derek Hagan (deceased), Miles Hagan, Maya Hagan, Morrisa Coleman and Corriisa Coleman, Makayla Jones, Erick Johnson Jr., Nathan Johnson, Justice Johnson.
