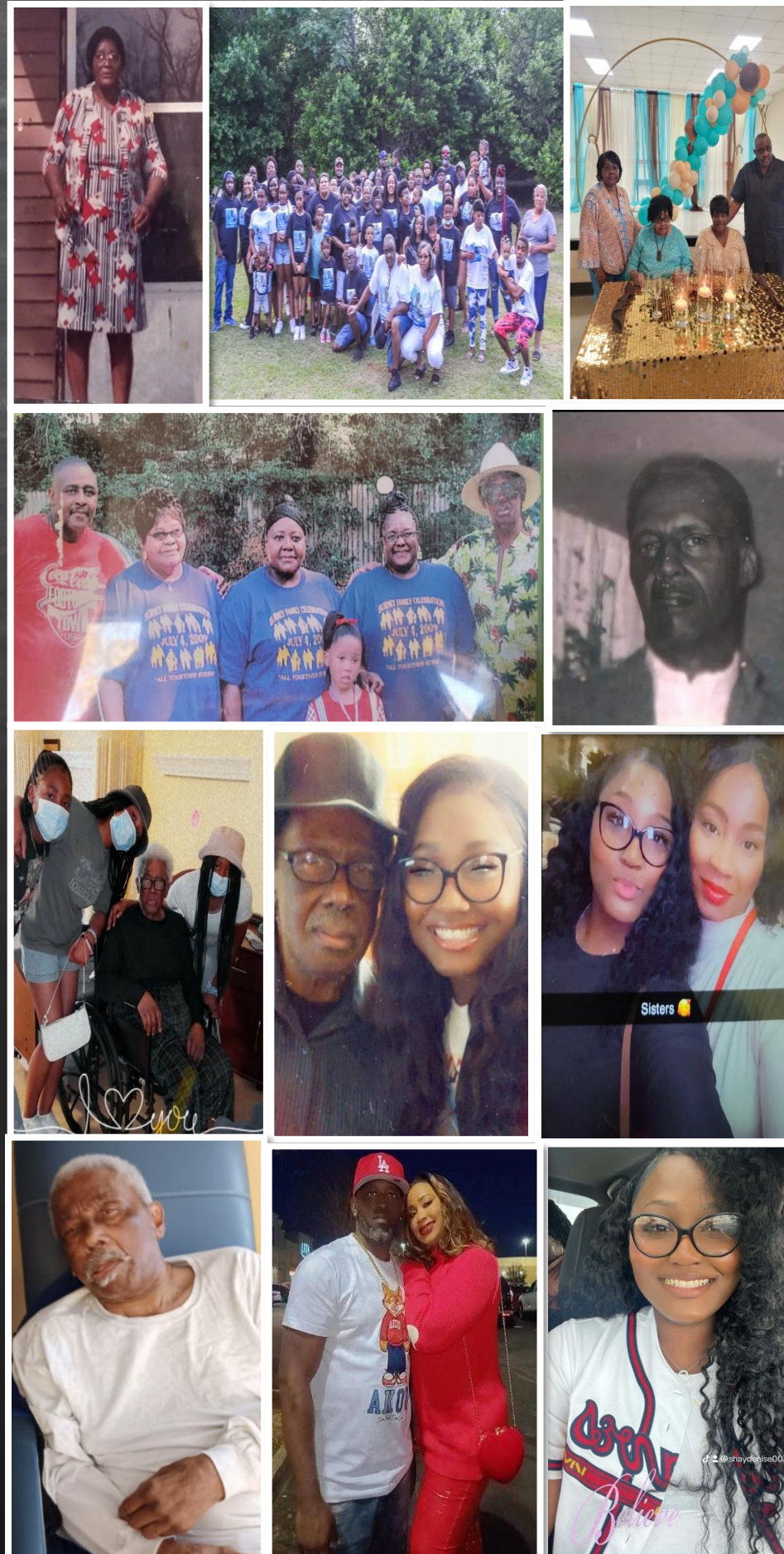
# His Life & Legacy
