# Reflections of Life

Mrs. Hattie Mae Odom Brown was born October 20, 1929, the sixth child of Lee B. and Mary Sales Odom, in Randolph County, GA. Her father was a sharecropper. Her mother was a homemaker. She was educated in a country school in the Vilulah Community and at Andrew Methodist School.

At a young age, she accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior and was baptized at the Vilulah Missionary Baptist Church.

At the age of seventeen, she met, fell in love and married Mr. Fletcher Seay. They lived briefly in Key West, Florida. They had three children: Diane, Fletcher, II and Paul. In search of better employment, Fletcher relocated to Syracuse, NY.

In 1954, Hattie married John Arthur Lawson. To this union, one child was born named Mary, after her maternal grandmother. In 1956, she met Andrew Brown, with marriage occurring some years later. To this union, one child was born – Anthony.

Hattie's work life was extensive. It was said that she could pick 500 pounds of cotton in one day. She worked as a domestic and as a dormitory house Mother at Andrew College. She worked at Joe-Anne Burgin Nursing Home for over 30 years as housekeeping director, Central Supply Manager, and Assistant Activity Director. She retired in 2009.

Hattie loved gardening, both flowers and vegetables. She has hanging baskets, and flowers on the carport, front stoop and the deck and all around the yard. Since she couldn't get out in the yard anymore, she planted tomatoes and green peppers in pots on her carport. She made good hot pepper sauce. Also, nobody made chicken dressing, sweet potato pies or lane and pound cakes like her. And delicious biscuits too!

Hattie joined Antioch Missionary Baptist Church and was a faithful member until her health declined. At Antioch, she was a member of Choir No. 2 and served as Church Secretary for many years. She was vice-president of the Mission Department, as well.



She was also active in the Chattahoochee Missionary Baptist Association and North Side Union Meeting where she began at a young age selling badges, was the Benefit Board secretary and later served as President of the Women's Department.

Hattie attended over ten National Baptist Conventions, Inc., traveling as far away as California. She was also very active in the General Missionary Baptist Convention of Georgia, Inc.'s Third District where she served for many years with the Women's Auxiliary as the Western Region Vice-President.

Hattie was also a member of Friendship Chapter #137, Order of the Eastern Star.

Hattie was preceded in death by her parents, her husbands, two sons: Fletcher Seay, II and Paul Seay; one niece raised like a sister, Florence Odom; one nephew that was like a son, Charles Odum; five siblings: Willie D. Odom, A. J. Odom; Martha Odom Davis; Zennie O. Snowden; and Joseph (Lenora) Odom.
