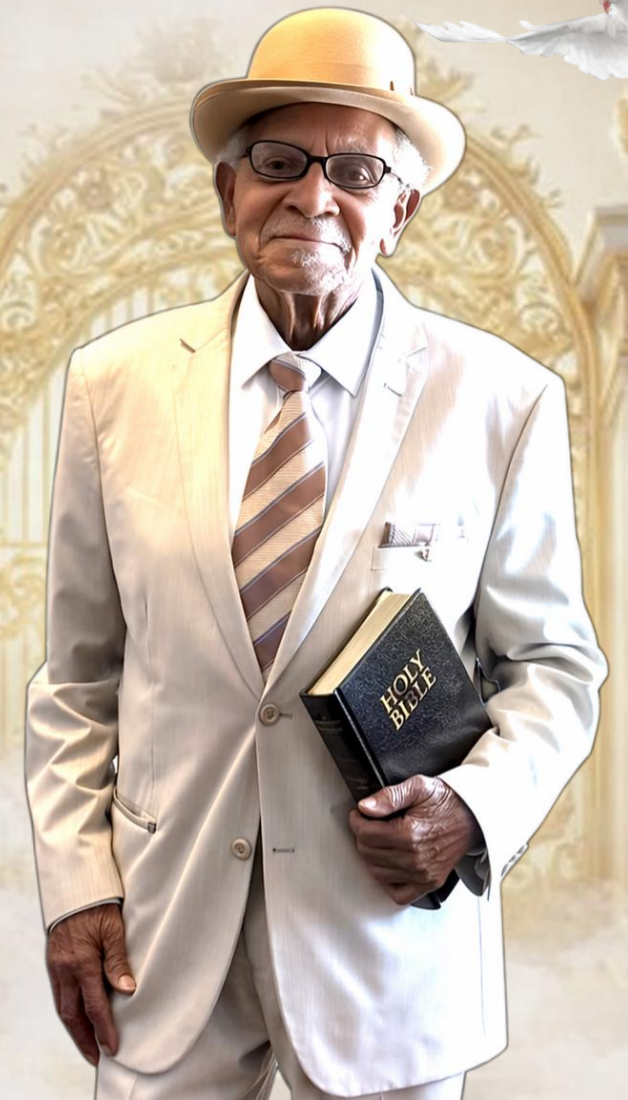

Reflections of Life

Life began for Deacon Douglas Cutts on October 14, 1936, in Lee County, GA. Douglas, affectionately known as “Pot,” was the sixth of 14 children of the late Mr. Charlie Cutts, Sr., and Mrs. Palace G. Cutts. He received his education in the public schools of Lee County.

At an early age, he joined Mt. Able Baptist Church in DeSoto, GA. He became a deacon in 1967 and served faithfully until his transition. He was the president of the Mt. Able choir since it was organized in 1970. Deacon Cutts loved to sing and serve the Lord. Douglas sang with a quartet, The Harmony Stars of Americus, GA, for over 60 years.

In 1956, Douglas pledged his undying love to the former Rosie M. Bess. They were married for 50 years before her transition in 2006. They were blessed with six children. To support his family, he was employed by the Lee County Board of Education as a bus driver for 27 years. He was also a self-employed farmer and landscaper. He enjoyed cutting grass, laying pine straw, and interacting with his clients.

On Monday, April 13, 2026, Douglas accepted his calling to eternal rest. He now joins those who went on before him — his wife, parents, siblings, and other relatives. Douglas leaves to cherish his memory: sons Pastor Gregory (Winnie) Cutts, Anthony (Sharon) Cutts, Honorable Mayor Vincent (Telisa) Cutts, and KaTory (Bernice) Johnson; daughters Betty Cutts Yancey, Minister Belinda (Pastor Ferlin) Tyson, Shirley Cutts Tatum, and Deatrice Holmes; 12 grandchildren; 14 great-grandchildren; sisters Mary L.
