# STORY OF *Catherlean*

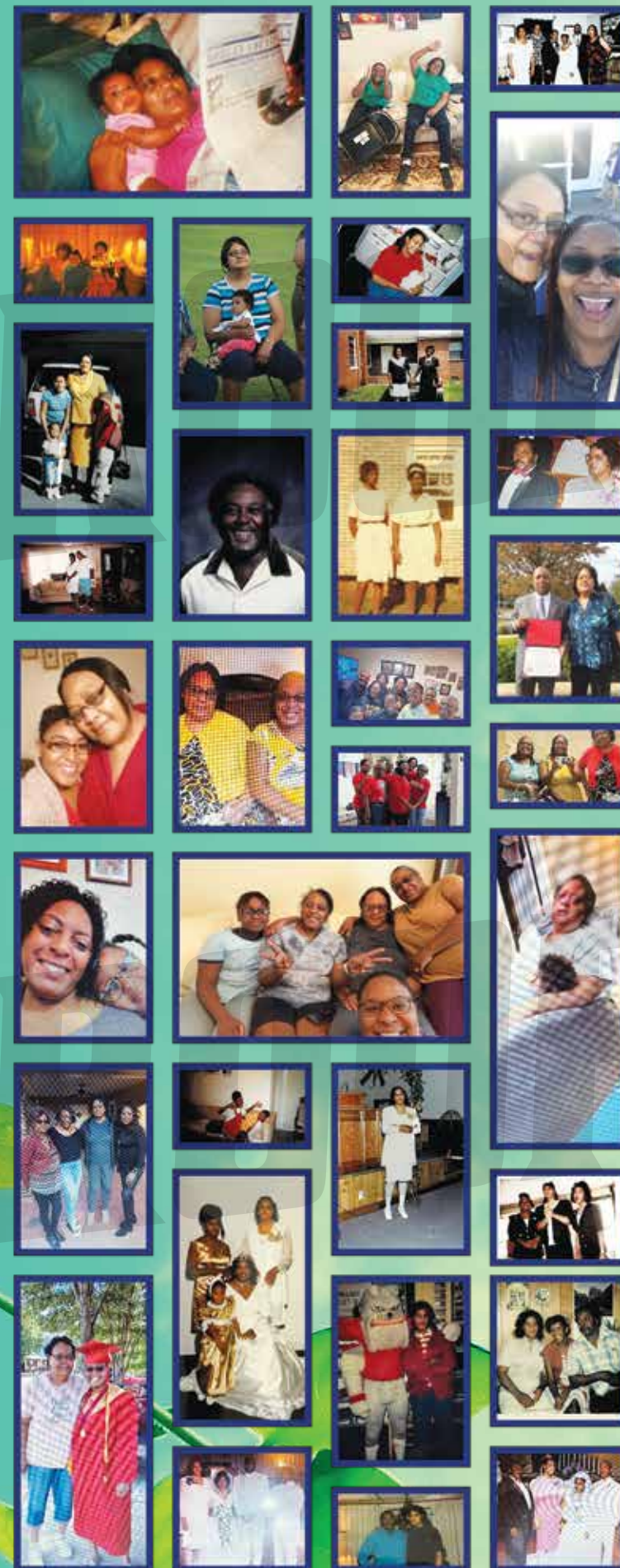
