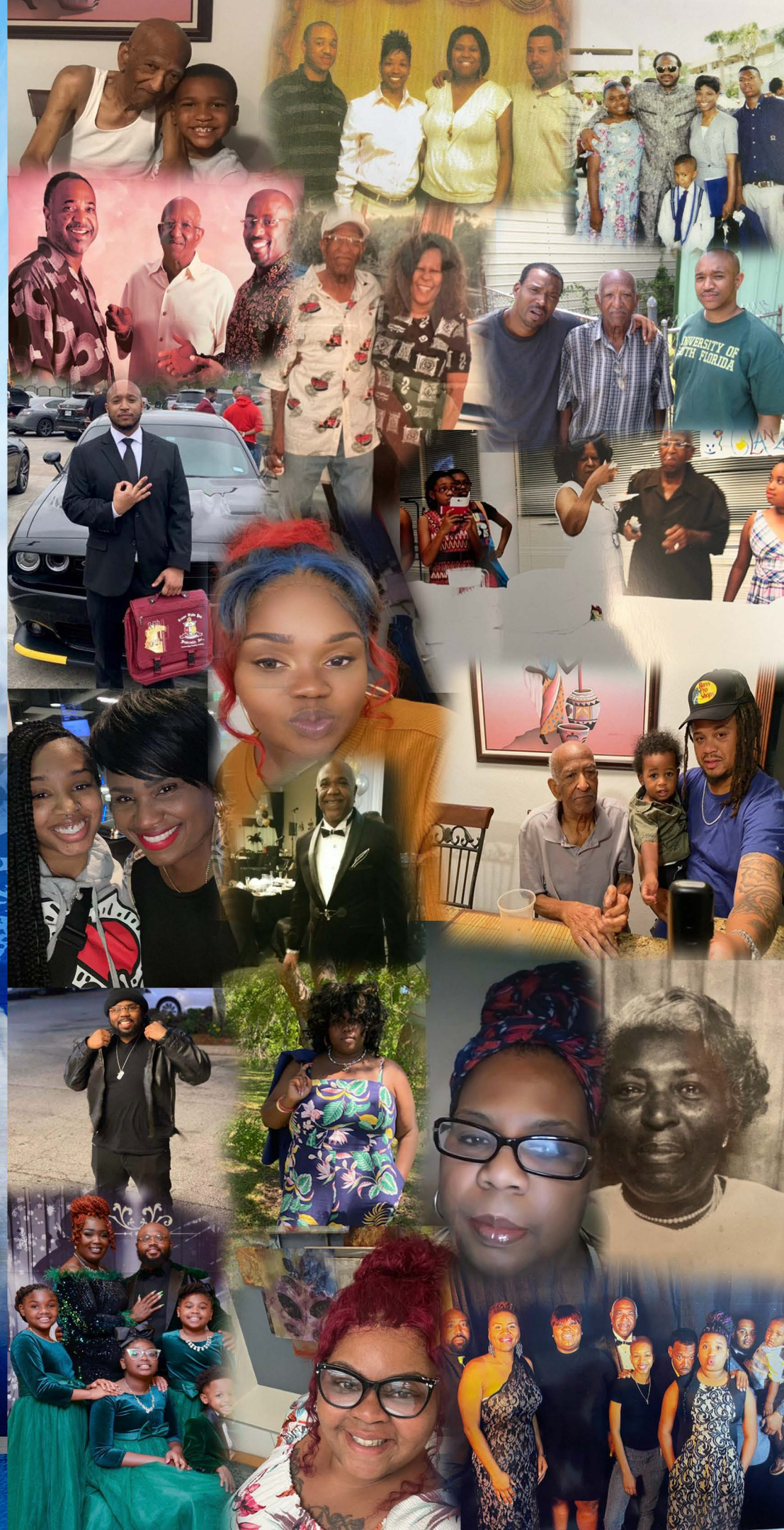
John was employed with American Coolair.
