Andy attended South Fulton High School, East Point Georgia He made an eternal commitment to Jesus Christ at a very early age and became a member of Harris Chapel United Methodist Church in Palmetto, Georgia where he began singing in the choir and was the president of the single's ministry.

Andy attended Chicago City College (Crane Campus), majoring in Journalism-English-and Prelaw. He was the Co-Editor of Crane Clarion Newspaper receiving numerous awards and honors. Andy graduated from Chicago State University in 1977 with relevant courses in Political Science. He was an investigator with the Chicago Transient Authority.
