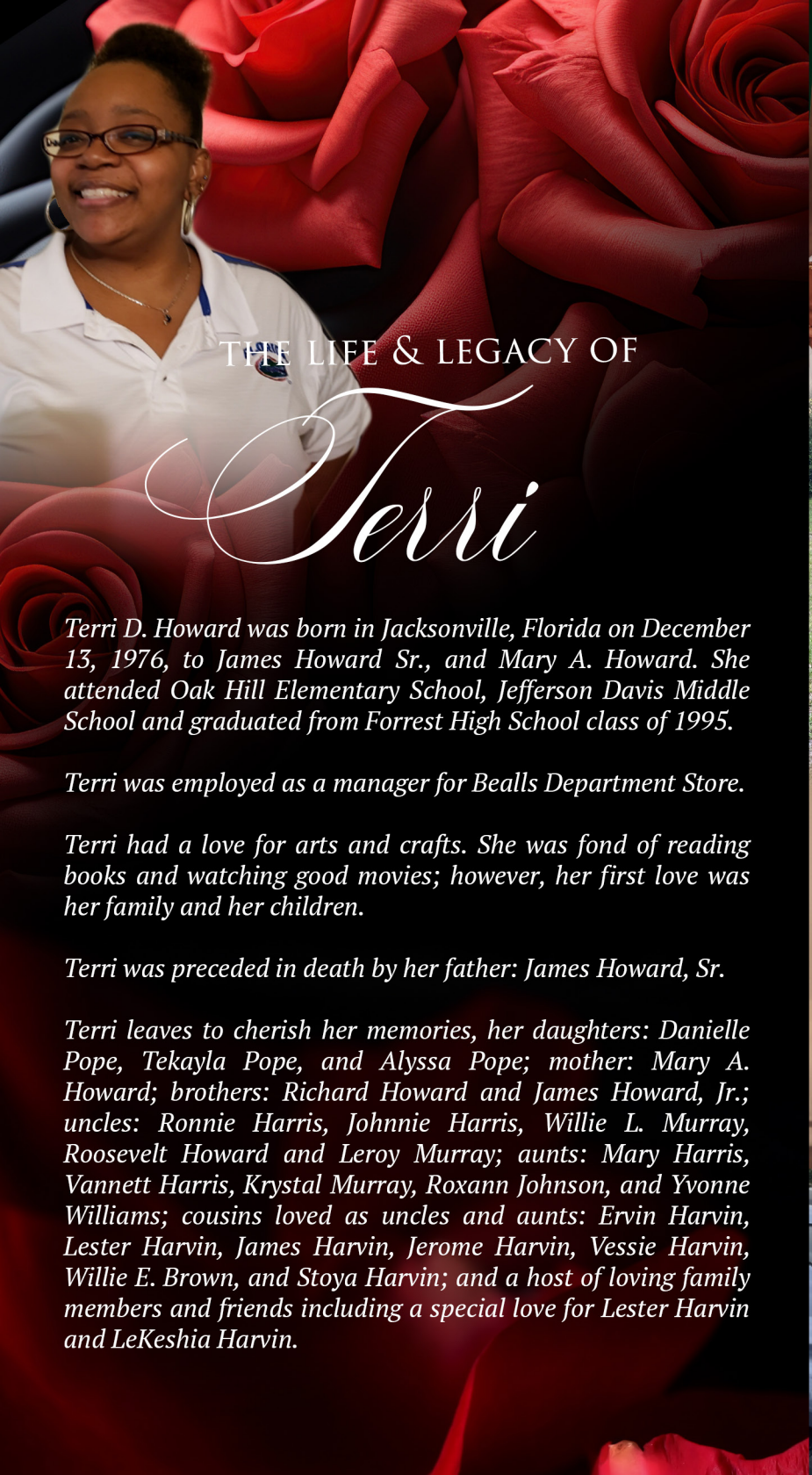
The Gift of Journey
