TEDDY'S LIFE STORY

TEDDY ROOSEVELT SIMMONS, SR., affectionately known as "TD", was born in Wadmalaw Island, South Carolina on April 11, 1956, to Teddy and Rebecca Simmons.

Teddy attended Rockville Elementary School and graduated from St. John High School, Class of 1974. Later, he obtained his Associate of Science Degree in Culinary Management from Florida State College at Jacksonville, graduating in December of 2014.

Mr. Simmons served our country in the United States Army from 1974 – 1980 as an Administration Specialist and was also a part of the Culinary Arts Team. After his discharge from the Army in 1980, he moved to Key West, Florida where he became a Commercial Fisherman (1980-1986) with his older brothers. While in Key West, he met and married his loving and devoted wife, Doretha Leland. They were joined in holy matrimony for thirty-eight years.

In 1986, he re-enlisted to the United States Army and became a Culinary Specialist. A notable accomplishment is when he entered the Olympics and won the "Best Exhibit in Show" award in 1992.

After retiring and moving to Jacksonville, Florida he went into business for himself opening, "It's B.A.D (Breakfast All Day)" food truck.

Teddy was a devoted member of the New Community Baptist Church where he served as a Deacon, New Member Class Leader, Vice President of the Male Chorus and President of the Lions of Juda Kids. He was a member of the Maceo Elks Lodge #8.
