You left us peaceful memories

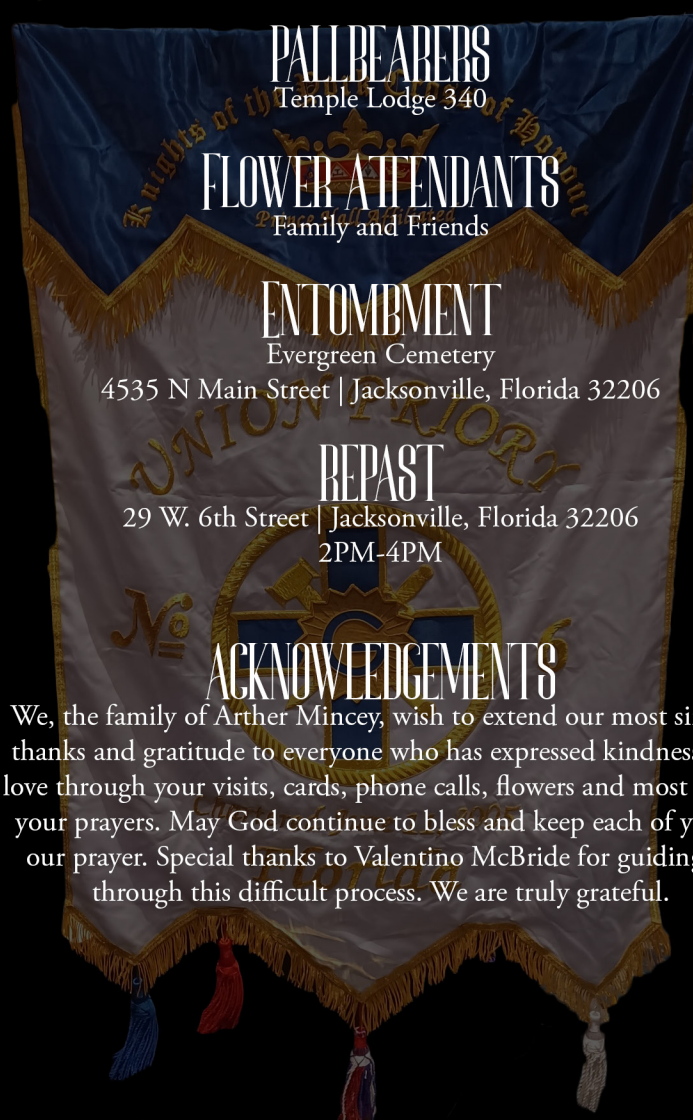
Your love is still our guide;
