With deep love and gratitude, we celebrate the life and legacy of Theodore Roosevelt Johnson, Jr., affectionately known as Teddy, who departed this life peacefully on July 31, 2025, at Memorial Hospital in Jacksonville, Florida, with his beloved wife by his side.

Theodore was born on July 25, 1944, in Jacksonville, Florida, to the parents of Theodore Johnson, Sr. and Darnell Johnson. He was the eldest of five children and a proud graduate of New Stanton High School, Class of 1965. During his time at Stanton, Teddy developed a lifelong love of music, playing the trombone in the school band for four years.

He continued his education at Bethune-Cookman College, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education. Following his graduation, Teddy returned home to begin a long and fulfilling career with the Duval County Public School System, where he served as a Health and Physical Education teacher, athletic coach, and Athletic Director. He coached football, basketball, and track and field, and over his 40+ years of dedicated service, he became a mentor and role model to countless students.

Teddy was also deeply committed to his faith. He began his ministry in the Church of God in Christ and later joined St. Joseph Missionary Baptist Church, under the leadership of Pastor H.T. Rhim, where he was licensed and ordained as a Baptist preacher. He served faithfully as Youth Minister and later as Minister of Education until his health declined.

On May 19, 1970, Teddy married Mary E. Sandlin, and together they built a beautiful life grounded in love, faith, and devotion. Their union was blessed with two children, Eureka and Lemmuel.

He was preceded in death by his parents: Theordore Johnson, Sr. and Darnell Johnson.
