

LIFE STORY

Lawrence Lamar Starling was a man whose life reflected his steadfast faith, love for family, and unwavering service to God. Born the third eldest of seven siblings, Lawrence grew up surrounded by love, laughter, and the values that would guide him throughout his life: faith, hard work, and humility. For forty-two years, Lawrence dedicated himself to Peninsular Warehouse/Suddath in Jacksonville, where he was admired for his integrity, work ethic, and quiet strength. Outside of work, his passion for basketball led him to serve as a referee for over thirty years, always fair, always patient, and well respected.

But his truest calling was in service to the Lord and his church family. A devoted member of New Bethlehem Missionary Baptist Church, Lawrence faithfully served in many capacities. He was the Chairman of the Finance Ministry and Trustees, Co-Leader of the Tribe of Joseph (Districts 3/4) and an active member of the Budget Ministry and Official Board. He also participated in the Men of Bethlehem (MOB) and the Seasoned Soul Vessels, where his wisdom and humor blessed those around him. Most recently, he was humbly serving as Deacon in Training, a role that perfectly reflected his servant's heart. Lawrence was the founder of the church's ministry, Breadbasket Food Pantry, where he proudly served as Ministry Coordinator. Through this outreach, countless lives were touched, and God's love was made visible through Lawrence's compassion and commitment to ensuring that no one in his community would go hungry.

A man of simple pleasures and great devotion, Lawrence loved his Florida Gators and the Jacksonville Jaguars. He especially enjoyed traveling with his beloved wife, Carol, and son, Ervan. His greatest joy, however, came from spending time with his family sharing stories, laughter, and love.

On October 27, 2025, Lawrence Lamar Starling heard a soft, gentle voice calling, "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls." — Matthew 11:28–29. Lawrence answered that call peacefully, entering eternal rest with his Lord and Savior.
