Bessie Mae Tutson Thomas, known to so many of us simply and lovingly as Ma Bessie, was born on Monday, October 5, 1925, in Tutson Lane, Jacksonville, Florida to Frank Tutson and Bessie Brandon Tutson. She was one of 7 siblings. She received Christ at an early age and served many years as an usher at Mt. Ararat Baptist Church and then Emmanuel Missionary Baptist Church. Ma Bessie was a domestic worker before becoming a custodian at Duval County Public Schools where she retired after 30 years of employment.
