GLORIA LORINE WILLIAMS ANDERSON, was born March 25, 1937, in Jacksonville, Florida. She was born to the late Deacon Calhoun James Williams and the late Overseer Hattie Mae Williams.

She began her Christian journey at a youthful age. Overseer Gloria L. W. Anderson accepted the calling of God on her life and served in her capacity as an usher, secretary, and Sunday school teacher. She then became a Deaconess, and from Deaconess to Missionary, from Missionary to an Evangelist, and from an Evangelist to an ordained Elder. She was then elevated to the Assistant-Pastor, and later under the ordination of Overseer Hattie Mae Williams, she became the Pastor of New Apostolic Shiloh Holiness Church in Jacksonville, Florida. Under this Ministry she diligently served side-by-side with her mother, in whatever role or capacity her hands found to do.

Overseer Gloria attended Duval Public Schools Douglas Anderson #107 and graduated from New Stanton Senior High School, Class of 1956. Her higher education was as follows: formerly, Edward Waters College (EWC), now Edward Waters University (EWU) and formerly, Florida Community College of Jacksonville (FCCJ), now Florida State College of Jacksonville (FSCJ) in the Nursing Assistant and Home Health Aid programs. Lastly, she graduated from Jacksonville Theological Seminary in 1997.

For over fifty-five years, Dr. Anderson devoted her life to teaching at Apostolic Shiloh Kindergarten of the Southside Community, affectionately known as A.S.K., where she welcomed countless children into their first classroom experience. She was known for her patience, warmth, and ability to make every child feel seen and valued. She left an indelible mark on the lives of students, colleagues, and families alike. Her legacy lives on in the laughter of children, the lessons carried forward by her students, and the love she shared so freely.

On August 29, 1959, Overseer Dr. Gloria L.W. Anderson, married her "Sugar Lumpy" and the love of her life, Howard R. Anderson. He supported her faithfully and never left her side. From this union they gained four children and others were lovingly added along the way.

Overseer Gloria L. W. Anderson was ordained as the Overseer and Pastor of New Apostolic Shiloh Holiness Church on December 9, 1990. Inspired by the great spiritual "Take Time to Be Holy," Overseer Anderson dedicated her life to the Lord, teaching, preaching, and inspiring many souls to seek the Lord. Under Pastor Anderson's ministry, many souls have been saved and baptized in the name of Jesus, along with many lives being touched with the truth of God's Word. The scripture, Romans 12:1, "... present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God which is your reasonable service" was the foundation on which her daily walk with God continued, living a Holy and Sanctified life in JESUS' Name.

Dr. Gloria L. W. Anderson, a devoted wife, mother, grandmother, sister, aunt, friend, overseer, pastor, a beloved kindergarten teacher whose stern, firm guidance and joyful spirit shaped generations of young learners, passed away peacefully on December 11, 2025 at the age of 88.

Her commitment to spreading the Gospel extended beyond the church walls. Her unwavering faith and dedication to spreading God's Word were the cornerstone of her life. She lived what she preached and was known for her compassionate heart and powerful prayers, Overseer Anderson touched the lives of many, both within her church and in the broader community. Affectionately known as, "The Mother of Southside", she was a guiding light, a counselor, and a spiritual mother to those who looked to her for leadership. Her teachings and examples of faith will continue to inspire generations to come.

She was preceded in death by her parents: Deacon Calhoun & Overseer Hattie Mae Williams; her brother: Bishop Calhoun J. Williams, III.; a son; a special daughter: Sheatell McGriff Crawford; sisters, and grandson: De'Angelio Whitehead.

She leaves to celebrate a life well lived and to cherish her precious memory, a devoted loving husband: Howard R.
