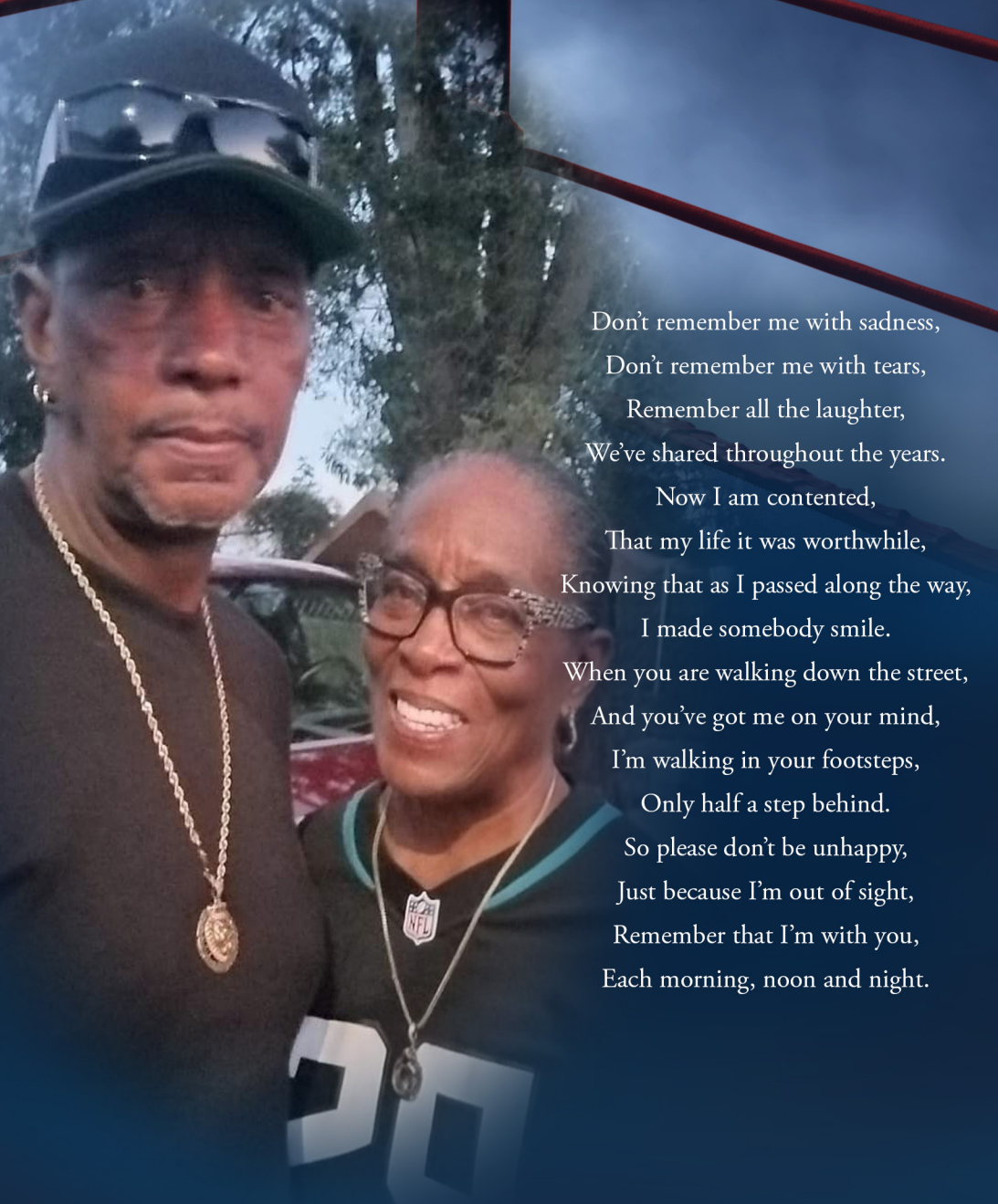


TRIBUTE
