Life Story

Dieuveula Louis Samedy was born on January 12, 1978. She was the daughter of Mrs. Heureuse Louis and the late Mr. Arnold Louis. She was Mrs. Heureuse's second daughter. She had an older sister named Martine, an older brother Alain, and a younger sister Sandra. She also had three nephews and four nieces in the family.

She completed her primary education at Collège la Martinière and her secondary education at Collège Etzer Vilaire. After finishing high school, she earned a diploma in phlebotomy. In 1996, she met Emile Samedy, and they married after several years of engagement. From this union, the couple had a daughter named Jemika Sarah Samedy.

Dieuveula was a servant of God who deeply loved others. She never held grudges against anyone. Even when someone wronged her, she was always ready to apologize. She was always willing to pray for those to whom she regularly offered her advice.

On November 5, 2023, after a long absence, she decided to come visit us. She arrived overwhelmed by pain; a week later, on November 13, 2023, we rushed her to the hospital. She immediately had to undergo surgery, during which it was revealed that she was suffering from intestinal cancer.

A year later, she had to undergo a second surgery, followed by several cycles of chemotherapy. While she was undergoing treatment, her husband, who was in Haiti, passed away after a stroke in September 2024.

Although her cancer was at a very advanced stage, she continued to work despite our insistence that she rest. She only stopped working in January 2026 after a routine hospital visit, where we were told she might have only six months left to live.

She suffered greatly, but she kept telling us that she was not afraid. On the contrary, it was her who encouraged us despite her pain. She was surrounded by loved ones, yet she never revealed to them that she had cancer. She knew very well that she had to continue helping others. Even while burdened by this illness, she continued to pray for those who were sick. Whenever God allowed it, she gave advice to married couples for the well-being of their homes.

She was not just an ordinary woman, she was a woman of God and an angel among us, whom God chose to call back to Him on March 25, 2026. From the moment one had a conversation with Dieuveula, one could feel being in the presence of a person with a soul of immense kindness.

If she could speak to us today, she would say: "Thank you for your prayers and your support." She would tell us how much she loves us and how much she would sometimes want to hold us in her arms, but sadly, she no longer can. If there is a way to honor the memory of our sister Dieuveula, it is to give glory to God.

Each time we think of her, may we show even more love and care for others, just as she did.
