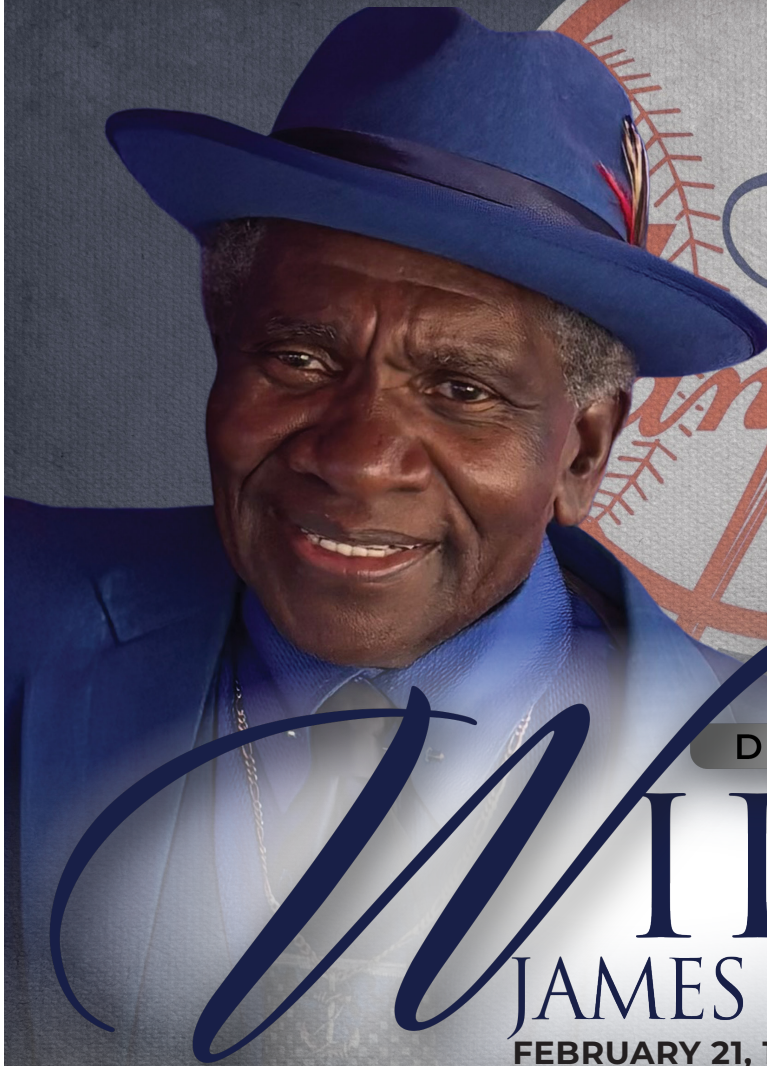

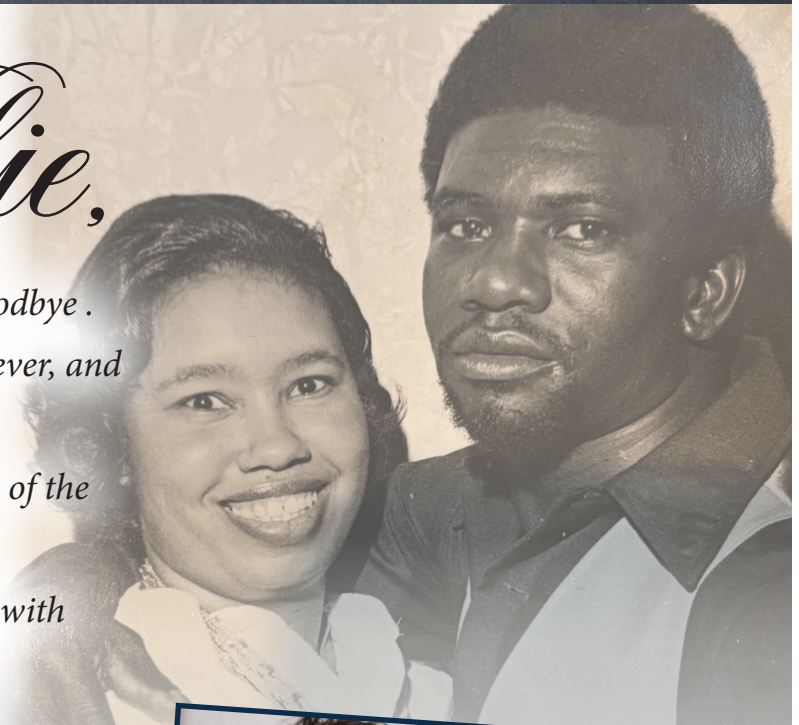

Deacon Willie James Rivers, Sr., son of the late Kato & Albertha Gibbs Rivers, was born February 21, 1945. Reared in the Burton community of Beaufort, SC. Willie attended the public schools of Beaufort County and the Robert Smalls High School. As Willie transitioned into adulthood, he entered the workforce, where he held various jobs. He worked with Trask Farms, Independent Nail Factory, Exxon Gas Co., Parker White Metal Company, and Atlantic Industries. While employed with Atlantic Industries, Willie severely injured his back and was no longer able to work. Not letting that stop him, he continued working different odds and ends and whatever he was able to do.

At an early age, Willie accepted the Lord Jesus as his Savior, and joined Pine Grove Baptist Church, Beaufort, SC. 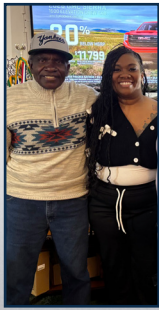
