



















John Luther Patterson II, 51, was born August 16, 1972, to Elaine Wingate Friday and the late John Patterson, Sr. in Lincolnton, North Carolina. He transitioned to be with his heavenly father on Wednesday, April 3, 2024, surrounded by his loving family. He was a long-time resident of the Charlotte and Huntersville area.

John, affectionately known as "Scoobie" attended Ranson Middle School. He was a proud "Dub C" Lion who attended West Charlotte Senior High School, Class of 1990, where he played baseball. After graduation, he met the love of his life, Mignon, while working at Winn Dixie Supermarket. They got married on May 25th, 1996, and from this union two beautiful daughters were born: Bria Elizabeth and Kayla Catherine. John was an amazing husband and father. He was active in his daughter's activities and school events, serving as a cheer and track dad, as well as PTA president during their elementary years.

John attended Central Piedmont Community College majoring in Business Administration. He later went to attend New Horizon School of Real Estate where he earned his certification in North Carolina and South Carolina Real Estate.
