

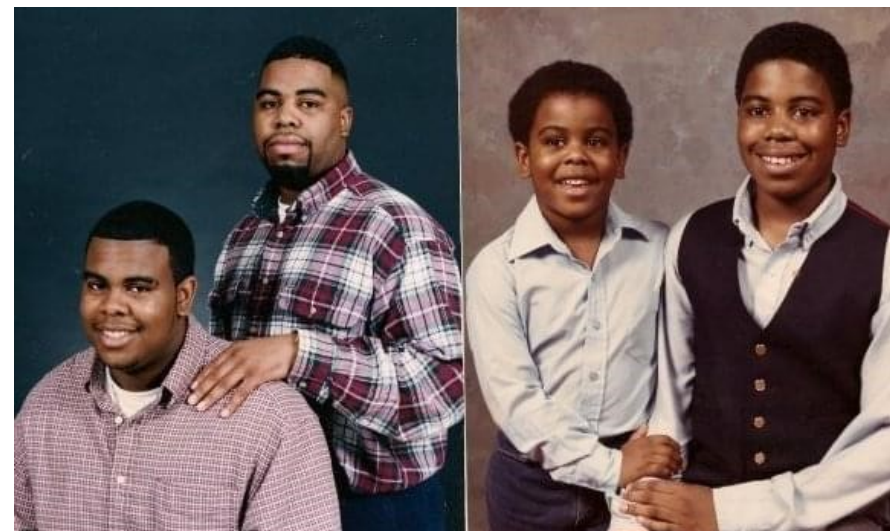

John Luther Patterson II, 51, was born August 16, 1972, to Elaine Wingate Friday and the late John Patterson, Sr. in Lincolnton, North Carolina. John, affectionately known as “Scoobie” attended Ranson Middle School. He was a proud “Dub C” Lion who attended West Charlotte Senior High School, Class of 1990, where he played baseball. After graduation, he met the love of his life, Mignon, while working at Winn Dixie Supermarket. They got married on May 25th, 1996, and from this union two beautiful daughters were born: Bria Elizabeth and Kayla Catherine. John was an amazing husband and father.
