Gail was born in Gaston County, on April 6, 1954, to the late Clinton Gibson and Eliza McCorkle Gibson. She peacefully transitioned into the arms of our Lord and Savior on Wednesday, April 10, 2024, at Novant Health in Huntersville, North Carolina.

Gail was a 1972 graduate of East Lincoln High School. After graduating, she worked for several years at Mohican Mills, in Lincolnton, North Carolina while attending Gaston College part-time to become an EMT. She extended her education and later became the first black female Paramedic in Lincoln County, with recognition as Paramedic of the Year for three consecutive years prior to retiring.

Gail decided to embark on a new career path with Lincoln County Department of Corrections. Gail later transferred to the Dallas Department of Corrections as a Correctional Officer, moving over to Administrative Assistant before retiring after 20 years of service.

In addition to her father, Gail was preceded in death by her sister, Delphine Mack.
