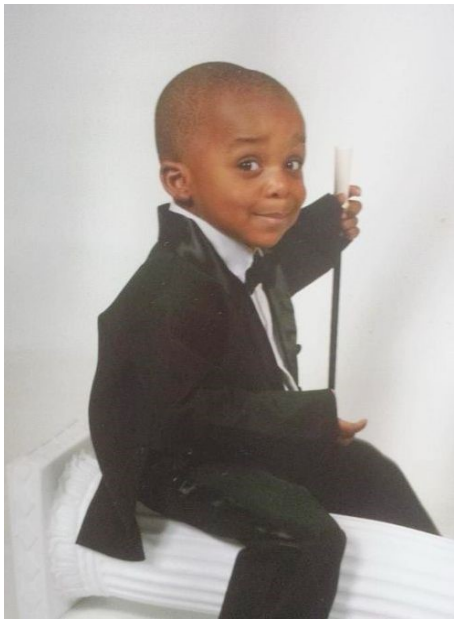

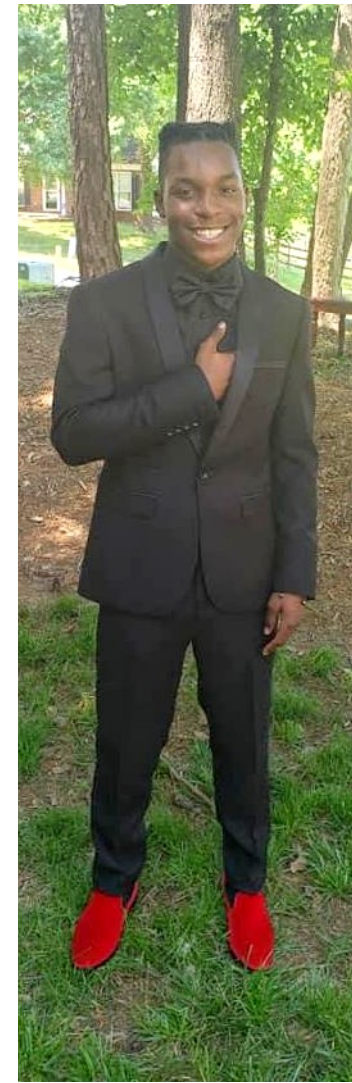


Life Reflections
