


When I come to the end of the day

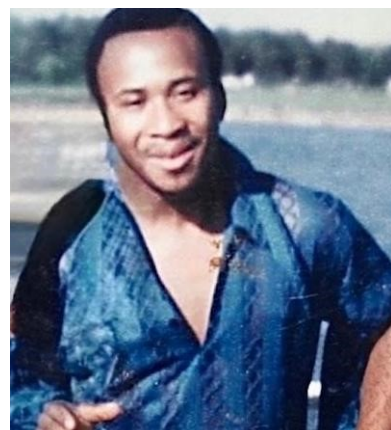
