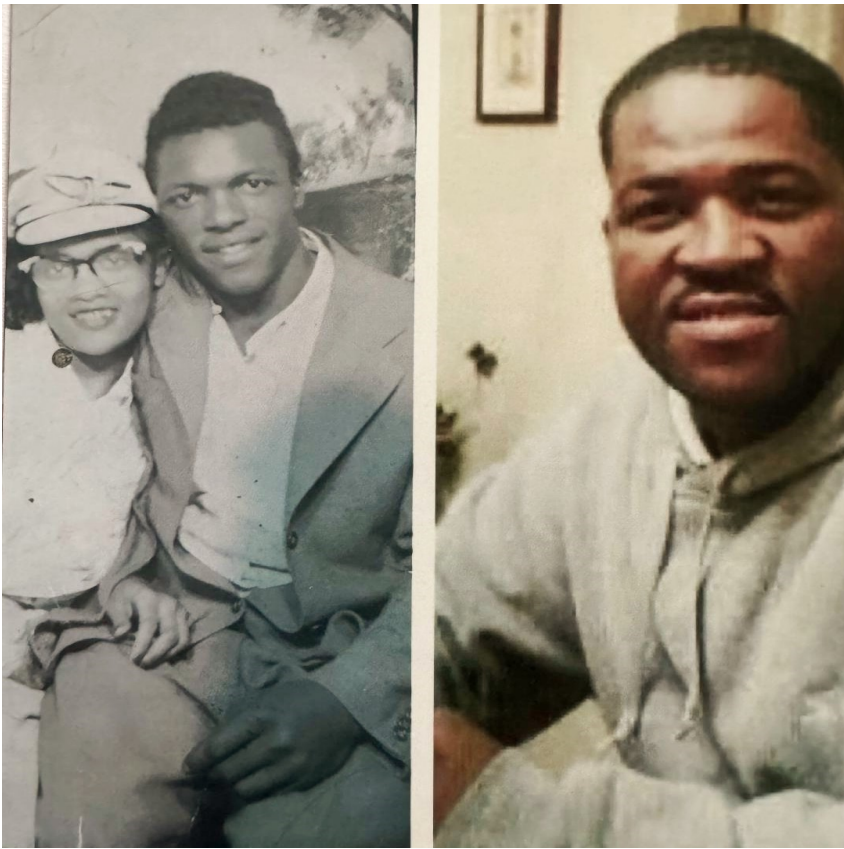




LIFE REFLECTIONS
