**E**lder Daniel Armstead, I, peacefully stepped into eternity on January 4, 2024, surrounded by his family. Born on March 11, 1949, in Canton, to the union of David Sr. & Susie Lee Armstead, Daniel was the epitome of strength and resilience.

Elder Daniel was a proud graduate of Canton McKinley High School. He also dedicated a significant portion of his life to serving his country as a proud member of the United States Army. After completing his military service, Daniel built a successful career as a grinder in the manufacturing and production industry employed by Canton Casting.

Daniel's greatest joy stemmed from fostering a loving and nurturing home. Married to his beloved wife, Carmella, on December 18, 1971, they shared an enduring bond that illuminated the lives of their children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren.
