She did not simply speak faith; she lived it daily. Through her example she taught resilience, compassion, forgiveness, and the importance of keeping God first in all things. Her covering of prayer will continue to surround her family for generations to come.

Sandra enjoyed spending time with her family, going to church, praising the Lord and sharing His word. She loved flowers and gardening, decorating her home for the holidays, playing dominoes, listening and dancing to music, and cooking meals that brought everyone together.
